Unexpected

WHAT IS PER CAPITA?

The Presbyterian Church (USA) believes in the priesthood of all believers, thus we are all equal. A good way of stating and showing that we are equal is by Councils (General Assembly, Synod and Presbytery) sharing their administrative cost equally among their members. Therefore, each council informs its members what it needs in order to pay salaries and administrative expenses to do its work on the member's behalf.

In 2017 Per Capita breaks down this way:

General Assembly is asking all members to pay \$7.50 per member.

Synod of Lakes and Prairies (which encompasses Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, North and South Dakota, about half of Nebraska and a small portion of Montana and Upper Peninsula of Michigan) is asking \$5.30 per member. John Knox Presbytery is asking \$17.00 per member.

We are considered members in each of these Councils therefore our 2017 grand total per capita is \$29.80/member.

339 members of the Presbyterian Church of West Salem times \$29.80 per member = \$10,102.20 our per capita for 2017. These dollars will leave our checkbook and could be likened to a season ticket to enter sporting or entertainment events. At times the sporting or entertainment event doesn't measure up to our expectations. At other times, it exceeds our expectations. So also, is the larger church. Per Capita is our "season ticket" to be part of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

#Some members make a pledge and believe per capita is part of that pledge. Others make a "special payment" indicating on their check this is per capita. Either way is acceptable. The session merely wishes for you to be informed about what per capita is and how much it is that we pay to the larger church on an annual basis. If you have other questions concerning per capita, contact one of the pastors or a session member.#
