



JOURNEY TO JERUSALEM

As the crow flies, it is 6,200 miles from West Salem, WI. to Jerusalem, Israel. This year part of our Lenten journey will be to walk the miles from here to Jerusalem with Jesus. We will begin our Journey to Jerusalem with Jesus in Capernaum and go through Gadara, Mt. Tabor, Sychar, Jericho, Bethany and finally reach Jerusalem. Each week members of the congregation will be asked to log the miles they walk that week as we hope to reach our goal of 6, 200 miles at the end of our Journey. Throughout this adventure we hope to deepen our faith and practice getting regular exercise as we care for our souls and bodies this year.

On Ash Wednesday, March 1st, you will receive your travel passport that will be stamped every Wednesday at Worship and you will also receive all the details of our Journey to Jerusalem and alternate ways of getting miles if you are not able to do much walking. If you have a smart phone, we encourage you to download the "Pacer" free app to log your miles (or another app of your choosing). We will also have pedometers available for those who don't have a smart phone.

A Note from Pastor Stephanie:

On Friday, January 20th, I made a trip to my hometown, Prairie du Chien, to visit the gravesites of my mom, dad, and brothers, Russell and Karl. I make a few trips there every year near the Anniversary of their death dates to remember them and pay my respects for being blessed by their presence in my life! This year on February 4th it will be 20 years since my mom died and on March 1st it will be 15 years since Russell died.

I extended my trip to Prairie this year by many miles so I could drive over several bridges that my brother, Russell and his company, Acme Construction, built. My favorite Bridge was built in Bridgeport on the way to Wyalusing campground for which Russell received a state award for the design of the bridge.

All bridges function basically the same way...they span a chasm. Bridges make it possible for someone to pass from point "A" on one side of the chasm to point "B" on the other side. Driving over some of Russell's bridges, I was once again reminded that as Christian people we are all called to be bridge builders in our lives. If we have a disagreement with another it is so easy to build a fence between us, but Jesus calls us instead to build a bridge so we can find our way back across the chasm that separates us. After all, Jesus is the greatest, highest and strongest bridge ever built over the river of sin and he invites us to strive to build bridges of love to those who are struggling to find a way back, a way in, a way across the bridge that separates them from being part of a family of God.

As disciples of Jesus Christ we are called to build bridges to lead the lost back across the chasm that has separated them from Jesus Christ. As disciples we are called to build bridges to those who feel forgotten or have strayed from the flock, so they can come back into the fold where they are loved by God and by us. We are called to build bridges to the hurting and helpless, to those who feel demeaned and less of a person to let them know that no matter who they are, God loves them, Jesus died for them and there is always a way for them to cross that chasm and come back "home" where they matter to God and to us!

I close with one of my favorite bridge stories that I hope helps us become even better bridge builders in our lives:

Once upon a time, there were two brothers. Their father had a large farm and when he became too old to work, he called his sons to him. "I am too old to work anymore," he said. "I will divide my farm in half and give each of you one half. I know that you will always work together and will be good friends."

When the brothers first started farming on their adjoining farms, they were the best of friends and would share everything together. Then, one day there was an argument between the two brothers and they stopped speaking to one another. For many years, not a word was spoken between them.

One day, one of the brothers was at his house when a carpenter came to his door and said, "I would like to do some work. Do you have any work that I can do?" The brother thought for a moment and then replied, "I would like for you to build a fence on my property. Build it down near the stream there that separates my farm from my brothers. I don't want to see my brother any more and I would like for you to build a high fence there please. I'm going into town and I'll be back this evening.

When he came back that evening, he was shocked to see that the carpenter had not followed his instructions. Instead of building a high fence there, he had built a bridge over the stream. The man walked down to take a look at the bridge, and as he did, his brother walked toward him from the other side. His brother said, "After all the terrible things I've done to you over the years, I can't believe that you would build a bridge and welcome me back." He reached out to his brother and gave him a big hug.

The brother then walked back up to his farmhouse to talk to the carpenter. "Can you stay?" he asked. "I have more work for you to do." The carpenter answered, "I'm sorry but I can't stay. I have to go, for I have many other bridges to build."


ALL INVITED—


