



To make the luncheon happen, 46 people worked at jobs such as publicity, arranged tables and chairs, decorated and set tables, sold tickets, greeted the public, waited on tables, poured beverages, filled and delivered carryouts, scraped, washed and dried dishes, cleaned the kitchen, put away tables and chairs, counted the money and took care of remaining tasks. The linen tablecloths and napkins donated by Aramark Co. made our dining room look elegant. Thanks to Helen Harold for picking them up and returning them. We received many compliments on the food thanks to

our great cooks! We served 234 people and had a profit of \$2449. Part of the profit came from money
