

What a Mountain!

#This month I'd like for you to consider, expectations. We all have expectations, some are small and some are large. At a restaurant, we expect our food to be fully cooked. At a concert, we expect the vocalist or band to be pleasing to our ears. We expect law enforcement to be just, preachers to be honest, teachers to present their material in an understandable fashion. At times our expectations are met, sometimes they are surpassed and sometimes our expectations are not met at all.



You will be reading this after I have come home from hopefully seeing the highest point on the North American Continent, Denali. I have a grand expectation, as I write this letter before leaving and that expectation is this: I will actually see the mountain. From what I hear some never see the mountain because it is cloud covered the entire time they are present.

I expect many will ask about our Alaskan adventure upon our return, and my second expectation is I will be able to tell you we had a blast, it was wonderful, what a mountain! My problem is this: this Lamplighter article is due before I return home, so I'm writing this before I have even left to head north to Alaska.

Expectations are a huge part of faith. We expect for Jesus to do what He has said He will do. We expect the indwelling of the Holy Spirit to empower us to remain faithful. We expect the promise of eternal life to be true. We expect our faith is not in vain and that we will receive a crown of glory at some later point in time. And we expect the church to support us in our time of need.

Here is the thing – I believe there is a big mountain named Denali – which stands above all others in this Continent even though I have yet to see it with my own eyes. And even if I come home and tell you I never saw the mountain, I will still tell you I believe it is there. I hope I get to see Denali but my belief in its existence is not dependent upon my actually seeing it in person.

Faith is a very similar idea. Christ calls for us to believe even if we cannot or have not seen with our eyes. To believe and act on that belief is the call Jesus makes for our lives. At times, we are to believe without seeing and at other times we can say I have seen it with my own eyes.

Pastors can talk until they are blue in the face about faith, telling all faith is real. There are times we experience faith through others. Believing because they have seen. And there are times we need to experience faith for ourselves, see the mountain if you will. When we experience faith for ourselves we can say, what a mountain! When we have not seen for ourselves, we can still say, others have seen it and told me about it, therefore I believe.

That brings me back to expectations, what do you expect from our God? I say, expect God to amaze you, so you will say with me, what a mountain!
