#### For unto Us a Child Is Born

#saiah 9:6 "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given, and the government shall be upon his shoulders; and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." This is one of those passages that people who have been around the church for years will say they know, but many also confess they don't know exactly where to find it.

There is a great difference between knowledge and experience. Knowledge is what Pastor Stephanie and I learned in Seminary. Much of that knowledge was very useful for the ministry some of it not so necessary. Experience, on the other hand, could not be taught in the classroom. Experience is something one must live through. I have never been in a tornado nor a hurricane situation, but I have gone to help clean up after a tornado destroyed a neighboring town and after Katrina devastated the Gulf Coast. Those experiences of clean-up are very different from seeing pictures on the television. Pictures on the television and in magazines may show us what the recent hurricanes have done to Puerto Rico but most of us can't say we know what those particular people have been through and are still going through. Only experience can offer that to a person.

So, what about Isaiah 9, knowledge may offer us a moment of joy because God has looked with favor upon us by sending this son. Knowledge gives us a little understanding of how great this son will be, for the government will rest on his shoulders. And knowledge offers us a list of names, which also communicates to us some of the aspects of who this child will become. Some people get excited with this type of knowledge, most place it in the back of their minds and may consider that knowledge from time to time.

My wish for us all is this: may the birth of Christ be more than knowledge for us this year. May this birth we celebrate be an experience in all its blessedness. May it be to us as joyful an experience as when our first child was born. May we be filled with wonder as little children when they see a stack of presents with their names on them. May this birth fill us with awe such as when we see a sunrise or sunset that takes our breath away. May we celebrate in such a fashion as to give thanks to God for giving us this ultimate gift, unto us a child is born.

As we move into this busy time of the year, as we seem to rush from one thing to the next never taking enough time to really appreciate the people around us, or the God who has offered us a Savior in Jesus Christ, may these few words "unto us a child is born" cause us to experience God and God's blessings in the weeks to come.
