## **Making Giving to Church Easier**

It is the aim of the Finance Committee and the Session to make donating to our church as easy and as convenient as possible. Everyone is now using credit cards and debit cards more frequently as well as having utility bills and other routine bills automatically deducted from a bank account. It was felt that this should be the case when giving to our church as well.

The church has contracted with Vanco to make this possible. You are now able to have money transferred from a bank account, from a credit card or from a debit card and have it sent to the church on a regular basis. The church will pay \$0.45 for each transaction from a savings or checking account. It will pay 2.75% of the amount plus \$0.45 when the money is transferred from a credit card or debit card. To use the service, you will need to advise Holly as to what amount you wish transferred, how frequently it should be done and where the money is to be transferred from. The money will then be deposited into the church's bank account and Holly will be informed that the transfer was made. The amount of the transfer can be changed at any time with a call to Holly.

It is the hope that this will make donating to the church as simple as possible.




