On March 6th we begin our Lenten Journey in Bangor where we gather for Ash Wednesday Worship. If
 the truth be told, we find ourselves kind of in a daze during Lent. We tire of calls to penitence. We are
 weary of words of suffering, sin, and death. And with Lent overlapping the lingering days of a winter that
 we have all grown a little weary of, it makes this season a difficult one to plod through.

The fact that Lent takes us on a pretty solemn journey toward Jesus' suffering and death makes it even
more difficult to face. Like the disciples, we would most likely doze off in the Garden of Gethsemane,
unable to bear the pressure. Like the disciples, we would most likely be in a daze as Jesus is led away like a
criminal to be tried and crucified.

■ Lent was never intended to be an easy journey. As a Pastor, Lent has always been the most trying and ■ tiring time of the year for me. Honestly by the time Easter arrives, I definitely need to experience a ■ Resurrection.

Perhaps this Lent, we all need a little jolt to encourage us to stick with this journey - perhaps we need to
 allow Jesus to startle us in ways we might not even know are possible....that's why this year Pastor Larry
 and I are working on a Lenten Series that will be a little different than usual. It will be scripturally based; it
 will be interactive to encourage us to get to know each other better, and it will have some excitement added in as we challenge one another in our faith journeys.

This year we will walk the difficult journey with Jesus to the cross in a *PURSUIT* to know Jesus on an even deeper level. We will experience the *TROUBLE'S* Jesus experienced; we will learn how to be truly *SORRY* for our sins; and we will hear the words Jesus Says to each of us personally as we strengthen our faith in him as our Teacher, Savior and Lord!

The hope is that at the end of our journey, we will all be ready to celebrate an Easter that is a high octane, bursting out all over, slam bang, bell ringing, cymbal crashing, startling, rip roaring jolt for all of us!

■ May our prayer every day during Lent be:

■ Startle us, O God, with your truth and open our hearts and our minds to your wondrous love. Speak your word to us; silence in us any voice but your own and be with us now as we turn our attention, our minds and our hearts to you, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
