Updated protocols for Covid-19.

Session has considered the May 13 guidance from the CDC on the wearing of masks by vaccinated individuals. The CDC does leave it up local jurisdictions, businesses, and venues to set their own rules for Covid protections.

The following guidelines will be followed to ensure a safe experience for In-person Worship:

- For the safety of those who can't be vaccinated children and extremely vulnerable individualsmasks are required for people that are not vaccinated. For those individuals who are vaccinated, masks are optional.
- Seating has returned to normal (pre-Covid) capacity.
- There will be live song leaders and special music. Worshipers are welcome to sing along.
- For the children's message, kids are invited to come up front. There will be marks on the floor for them to sit on to maintain social distance.
- Offerings will again be collected by the ushers.
- Each family should sign a bulletin and leave on the table in the back of the sanctuary.
- There will be no nursery provided, A limited fellowship time before service will resume in July.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Three weeks have elapsed in the Marriage with Regrets Bible study. "People have only attended via Zoom and none in person." Therefore, please note there will not be class at the church going forward. The link for the meeting can be found on the church website--Homepage. Study sheets will still be available at church if you would like to do it on your own. We will continue until I am done with the interim ministry.

So far in the inductive style of study we have covered Genesis 1 & 2 by looking at what the Bible says about men and woman's creation and what their purpose on earth is. We struggled with what it means to be made in the image of God and what the responsibilities are.

Genesis 1:27-28

So, God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."

One of the ways we use to make sure we cover all the ideas in the passage is to color code the words God, man, and woman (and their respective pronouns). Many times, when we study the Bible we bring our expectations to the passage and it influences what we think, but by slowing down our study, our assumptions can be challenged by Gods Word. Enlightening our ignorance and to bring new understanding of the Bible and God.

During this last year I have discovered a couple of sites on the internet that I recommend to you. The first is a podcast called "Retelling the Bible" by Kevin Mac-Leod. He has studied the passage in depth and through story telling he makes them come alive by examining the passage from a different perspective. I don't agree with everything he says but it challenges my assumptions.

The other resource is The Bible Project--just type in the name. I found this site when I was preparing for confirmation classes. It explains concepts and books of the Bible through a visual commentary format or (short videos). This video series was reported by the confirmation students as the best part of our study this last year and something they go back to even now when they have a question. Please check it out.

NEW HORIZONS COLLECTION

The Stewardship & Mission Committee's project for April is a supplies collection drive to benefit New Horizons Shelter and Outreach Program. New Horizons Shelter and Outreach Center is the only shelter of its kind within a 65-mile radius of the City of La Crosse. It's a shelter for individuals and families who have experienced domestic and sexual abuse. New Horizons is on the front lines advocating for and helping victims with many issues that some people may think do not exist in our community. New Horizons provides shelter and services to a seven county (population 238,236) area in Wisconsin and Minnesota and is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Currently, they are in need of the following:

- Women's underwear of all sizes
- Gift certificates (for gas, grocery, etc.)
- Men/women sweat pants or black leggings
- Youth joggers or black leggings
- Baby Orajel and new teething toys
- Earbuds or headphones
- New storage containers with lids (all sizes)
- Air Fresheners for room sprays (Febreeze, etc)
- Kitchen size garbage bags
- Prepaid phone cards

If you are able to donate any of these items to New Horizons, they can be dropped off at church anytime during July. There will be a box to place your items near the sanctuary doors. Thank you for your consideration in helping our neighbors in need!
